This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is effective as of $\underline{27^{th}}$ December $\underline{2021}$ (EffectiveDate) to establish an affiliation by and between

Sanchi University of Buddhist-Indic Studies, established under a Madhya Pradesh act no. 1 of 2013, Sanchi University of Buddhist-Indic Studies Act, 2012 of State Assembly of Madhya Pradesh, incorporated hereinafter referred to as SUBIS, of the FIRST PART,

And

Govt. Girls' P.G. College, Ujjain (M.P.), is an Affiliated College of Govt. of Madhya Pradesh established under UGC Act 2Fand12B having its office located at Ujjain District, Madhya Pradesh, hereinafter referred to as GGPGC, Ujjain, in the Second Part,

for the purpose of exchange of faculty, staff, students and Learning Resources.

The aforesaid institutions are hereinafter referred to individually as institute and collectively as institutes.

Preamble

WHEREAS, SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain have many areas of common interest in Humanities and Science considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research.

NOW THEREFORE, SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain have decided to enter into this Memorandum ofUnderstanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU), which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions set out in the following sections.

ARTICLE 1: OBJECT

Both Institutes agree to develop the following collaborative activities in the academic areasof mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity.

The two institutions shall seek to promote:

Faculty/Student/Staff Exchanges a.

- 1. The exchange of faculty to the mutual benefit of both institutions, Collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of mutual interest.
- 2. The exchange of academic materials and publications,
- 3. Conducting lectures,
- 4. Undertaking joint research,
- 5. Collaboration of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, attendanceof courses, upgrading of teaching and research skills,
- 6. Participating in seminars, symposia, and other types of academic discussions,
- 7. Co-supervising post-graduate students,
- 8. Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work.

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity; setting forth detailed arrangements for collaboration will be agreed. Educational visit, organizing Online and Offline mentoring Sessions, E-Resource Sharing and such exchange will be worked out between the institutes.

b. Other Areas:

- to exchange information on research and educational programs, (i)
- to exchange information on teaching, learning material and other (ii) literature relevant to their educational and research programs,
- to jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- to organize jointly seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- to propose and engage jointly in research or training programs (v)sponsored by funding agencies, and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- to exchange, if possible on a reciprocal basis, students at Undergraduate, Graduate and Doctoral levels for limited periods of (vi) time for purpose of education and /or research,
- (vii) the provision of cultural and intellectual enrichment opportunities for staff and students of both institutes,
- (viii) to use laboratory facilities in specific cases for a limited period,
- to permit students, staff and faculty members to use library facility and E-Resources.

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ARTICLE 2: COORDINATION

Each institution shall appoint one member of its teaching/research faculty to coordinate the programme on its behalf. Further, a coordination committee consisting of a programme coordinator from the side of SUBIS, and a programme coordinator from the side of GGPGC, Ujjain, will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two institutions.

ARTICLE 3: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain will not absolve any confidential information during the research activity.

ARTICLE 4: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in both institutes to this Memorandum.

Both institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and both institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Before any registration or commercialization of any intellectual property takes place, the institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation rights and revenue sharing.

Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be possible with the prior written consent of both institutes, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain shall be free to use perpetually the results arising out of the collaborating activities for their own internal teaching, research, educational, digital and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other party.

ARTICLE 5: VALIDITY

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of FIVE years commencing from effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review.

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ARTICLE 6: TERMINATION

Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of six months in advance to the other institution. Once terminated, neither SUBIS nor GGPGC, Ujjain will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

ARTICLE 7: AMENDMENTS/MODIFICATIONS

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutes.

ARTICLE 8: LEGAL EFFECT

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration. This is an Academic MoU and there will not be any financial obligations on either of the institutes (SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain)

ARTICLE 9: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In case, there is a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, Vice-Chancellor, SUBIS and Principal GGPGC, Ujjain will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit ofindependence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

SUBIS and GGPGC, Ujjain welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.
